Plaintiff Pamela Jensen filed a Complaint against the Social Security Administration and Carolyn Colvin the Acting Commissioner of the Social Security Administration on October 17, 2014. Accordingly, the undersigned recommends that this matter be dismissed for failure to prosecute.


NOTICE
